French gave words to English because the Normans invaded and brought French to England.

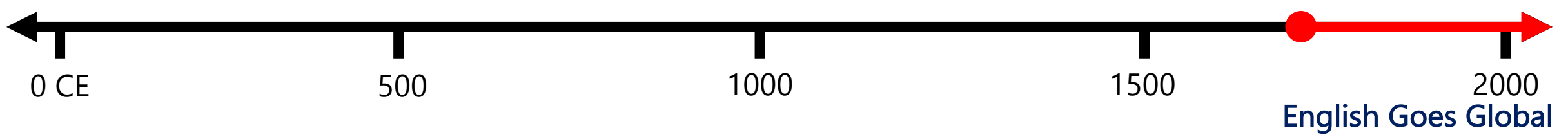
Latin gave words to English because the Normans invaded and brought French to England (which had lots of Latin words in it). Latin words also came into English during the Renaissance.

**trans** + port = through/across + carry (carry through)

When you transport something, you carry it from one place to the next; you carry it 'across'

The carrier truck was used to transport a swathe of new cars.

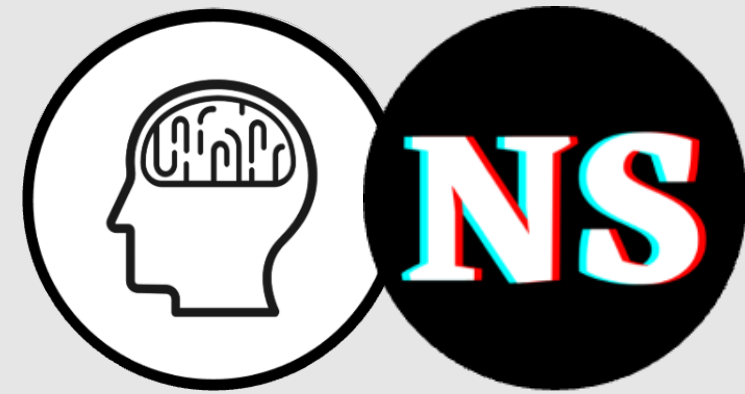
# transportable

1. **trans** port **able**
2. describing something as 'able to be carried across' – something that can be moved/transported from one place to another

# Closure

- port = base from Latin root
- port means carry
  
- transport has to two morphemes
- transport means carrying something across somewhere (and it can also be a noun- the name for vehicles that can transport things/people)
  - cars, planes, trains and boats are forms of 'transport' or 'transportation'

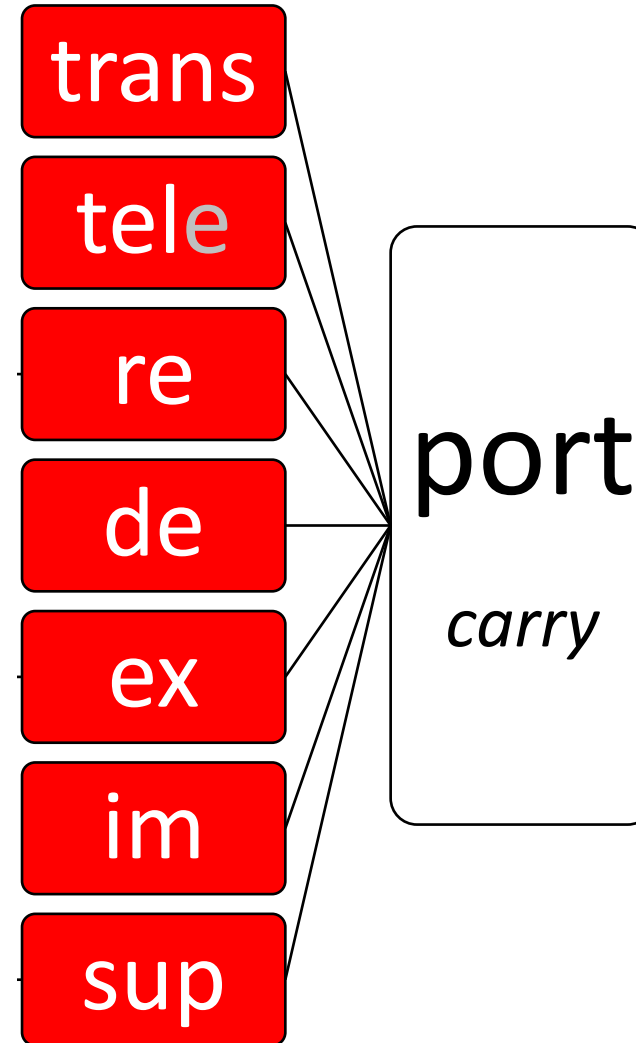

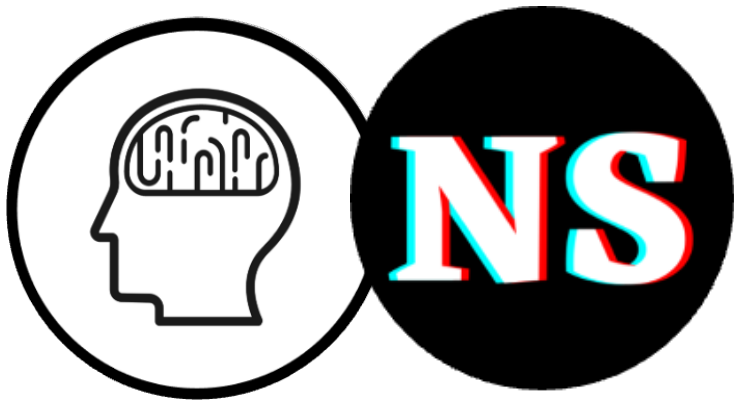
