
Why is English spelling more difficult than in many other languages?

English spelling is more difficult than in many other languages because it has borrowed words (and spellings) from many other languages.















Which languages mixed together to create Middle English?

trans + port = through/across + carry (carry through)
When you transport something, you carry it from one place to the next; you carry it 'across'


transportable

- 1. trans port able

Closure

- port = base from Latin root
- port means carry
- transport has to two morphemes
- transport means carrying something across somewhere (and it can also be a noun- the name for vehicles that can transport things/people)
 - cars, planes, trains and boats are forms of 'transport' or 'transport<u>ation</u>'



Link to Other Learning Areas	Get inspiration from Science, Humanities, Arts


